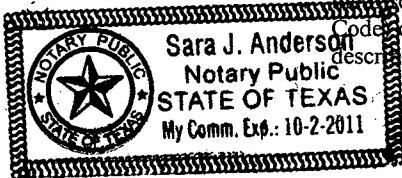

Section 176.003 of the Local Government Code requires certain local government officers to file this form. 
